President Herzek called the meeting to order at B101.

I. The minutes of the meeting April 5, 2016 were approved by acclamation.

II. Reports

A. President's Report

The President began by scussing student retention and completion.

In terms of freshmen, we are looking very good. We set a lofty goal to rise from 65% to 77%. This semester we are doing well with our cohorts of ASAP, Learning Communities, and College Discovery, and they have lifted us to approximately/83 of freshmen. We have found that being part of a cohort is very important, as ODLC figures are 93% and ASAP also 93% hey have in common case management advisement. So with no change in resources, the Fall 2015 cohort has a ratio of 85:1 with assigned advisors. We constantly reach out to each student instead of waiting for them to contact us. We all have a share in this success.

In terms of the Freshman KCC App, we did not expect much activity. But in Fall 2015 the buttons were ressed 2802 times, showing us the need for this. Figures included:

MTA Card button: pressed 480 times

Financial Aid – 336 Textbooks – 300 Residency – 245 Wellness and Health Services – 181 Academic Assistance 841 Child Care – 203 Food – 76

The Petrie Foundation is funding us \$450,000. This includes \$300,000 for emergency funds out of Tom Friebel's office to help our students, and \$150,000 towards a Health professions Career Program.

The 40 individuals on the Intercultural Center Committee have complete work. We have crunched numbers and created renderings for the space, and it will cost \$1.5 million for renovations and another \$1.5 million for planning Programs. We have raised \$400,000 to start working on some areas in Fall 2016 thanks in large part to Liz Basile. Many people will want to invest in this project, our students, faculty and staff.

Finally, Graduation will take place on June 21, Awards Night on June 20, and the Gala on June 23.

The President concluded his remarks.

B. Curriculum @mmittee Report

Committee Chair Edward Martin began by expressing his thanks to outgoing department chairs Gloria Nicosia and Loretta Brancae Tearas for all of their hard work and service to the committee

D. LegislativeCommittee Report

The Legislative Committee announded results of the campus elections held from May 2 – May 17, 2016In particular, the committee noted the lack of participation by members of the adjunct faculty in the elections held for their earmarked Delegaes at-Large established in 2010.

In this year's 20162018 elections, only 7 nominations were cast by more than 485 eligible voters. After ineligible ballots were disqualified, no nominees were successful in achieving the required minimun2 of ominations, and so no election was held. In the sixear history of these patime elections the maximum number of adunct participants has been 22, and fewer than 16 in nearly every election.

The Legislative Committee may reassess the status of these two seats in the near future.

A short discussion followed on this issue. Partne Delegate Prof. Feeley stated that shehad anecdotal evidence of at least one adjunct who could not log in to vote in the system, and suggested this might be prevalent. Also, adjuncts have a different mindset and need to be prepared ahead of time, and require other forms of contact besideshe college email system.
