



What Is Sexual Assault/Violence?

TN the use of force/threat
 TN ntimidation, or
 TN other coercion

<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>Sexual assault:

™Sexual assault ascrime.

™can be committed when someonehas not given or is unable to give consent, for example, due to

intoxication.

- <sup>™</sup>Sexual assault unwanted touching, grabbing, pinching, brushing up
  - against another's body,

™Dating, domestic and intimate partner violence.



However, if you report an incident to a Responsible Employee, such as a Department Chair or Athletic Coach, they are required to report to the Title IX Coordinator
