



³⁄₄Any form of sexual contact that occursthout consent and/or through:

TN the use of force/threat
 TN ntimidation, or
 TN other coercion

³/₄Sexual assault:

™Sexual assault ascrime.

™can be committed when someonehas not given or is unable to give consent, for example, due to

intoxication.

³/₄ Sexual violence:

- [™]Sexual assault unwanted touching, grabbing, pinching, brushing up
 - against another's body,

caressing, etc.

™Dating, domestic and intimate partner violence.

[™]StalkingCyberStalking


³/Knowing, voluntary and utual decision among all parties to engage in sexual activity

However, if you report an incident to a Responsible Employee, such as a Department Chair or Athletic Coach, they are required to report to the Title IX Coordinator
