THE CITY UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK POLICY ON DRUGS AND ALCOHOL

The City University of New York (CUNY") is an institution committed to promoting the physical, intellectual, and social elopment of all individuals. As such, CUNY seeks to prevent the use of drugs and alcohol, which can adversely impact performance and threaten the health and safety of students, employees, their families, and the general public. CUNY complies with all fedle state, and local laws concerning the unlawful possession, use, and distribution of drugs and alcohol.

Federal law requires that UNY adopt and implement a program to prevent the use of illicit drugs and abuse of alcollogistudents and employees. As part of its program, CUNY has adopted this policy, white the forth (1) the standards of conduct that students and employees are expected tow; (2) CUNY sanctions for the violation of this policy; and (3) reconsibilities of the CUNY colleges/units in enforcing this policy. CUNY's policy also (1) sets fortheth procedures for disseminating the policy, as well as information about the health risd faillegal drug and alcohol use, criminal sanctions for such use, and available couns etireatment, or rehabilitation programs, to students and employees; and (2) requires ealthing to conduct be iennial review of drug and alcohol use and prevention on its campus.

This policy applies to all CUNY students ployees and visitors when they are on CUNY property, including CUNYesidence halls, as wells when they are engaged in any CUNY-sponsored activities off campus.

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alcohol use, criminal sanctions for such used counseling, treatment rehabilitation programs available to employees or stustentust be distributed annually to all employees and students. The Chief Studefratines Officer shall be responsible for the distribution of this materiato students, and the Directofr Human Resources shall be responsible for the distribution of the material to employees.

The Vice President for Administration, or person performing the equivalent function at each college or unit of CUNY, all the responsible for onducting a biennial review to determine the effictiveness of CUNY's drug and alcohol program at its college or unit, and to ensure that sanctions for and alcohol violations are consistently enforced. Upon completion, the biennial rewimust be sent to the University's Executive Vice Chancellor and Chief Operating Officer. This rib review must include the number of drug and bohol-related violations and fatalities that occur on the college's campus or as part of the college six vities, as well at the number and type of sanctions imposed as a result of drug and related violation and fatalities that occur at the college as part of its activities.
