

Articulation Agreement
between
Kingsborough Community College
and
Monroe College

Kingsborough Community College and Monroe College enter into the following Articulation Agreement for the purpose of facilitating transfer of credits from the Kingsborough Community College to Monroe College.

This articulation agreement between Monroe College and Kingsborough Community College focuses on the procedures to be observed by graduates of Kingsborough Community College who have successfully completed the Associate Degree in one of the programs listed below and who wish to continue through Monroe College's baccalaureate degree in the corresponding program:

Kingsborough CC Program

A.A.S. in Computer Information Systems
A.A.S. in Accounting
A.A.S. in Business Administration
A.A.S. in Tourism and Hospitality

Monroe College Program

B.B.A. in Computer Information Systems
B.B.A. in Accounting
B.B.A. in Business Management
B.B.A. in Hospitality Management

This will apply to any student who is accepted based upon current admissions requirements. The Agreement is designed to provide coherence, consistency, and meaningful experiences to students in pursuit of their educational and career objectives.

This Articulation Agreement is designed to facilitate the most efficient and expeditious incorporation of Kingsborough Community College transferees into the student body of Monroe College.

The agreement will include the following:

1. Monroe College will accept up to 60 credits from those students who have completed a Kingsborough Community College Associate degree in good academic standing;
2. Courses completed with a grade of C or higher will be eligible for transfer credit provided they are part of the associate degree;
3. Non-credit or remedial courses adjudged to be below college level will not be accepted for transfer;
4. How the credits are distributed in the Monroe programs, and how many of the 60 credits actually do transfer will depend on the Monroe program into which the student is transferring and the Kingsborough Community College program the student has completed;
5. It is understood that if a student does not have the foundation or skill to enroll in an upper-level course because the student has not taken the necessary introductory course(s), the student will be required to fulfill any unfulfilled prerequisite. Therefore, Monroe College cannot assure every student the completion of the requirements for the baccalaureate degree in four semesters;
6. Monroe College's catalogue contains all information about degree requirements. Students wishing to plan their associate-degree programs to ensure meeting requirements are encouraged to communicate early with the
