Admission requirements for Bachelor of Science in Health Services Administration:

An associate degree in a health science program of study with a minimum grade point average of 2.5, and appropriate Licensure or Certification in hand or pending.

OR

An associate degree from a program that has an articulation agreement with the NYCCT HSA program with a minimum grade point average of 2.5;

OR

An associate degree with a minimum grade point average of 2.5 and at least five years of alternative work experience in a health care setting or related field as determined by the HSA program coordinator.

Articulation with the Community Health Program, (Gerontology Concentration) at Kingsborough Community College with the New York City College of Technology's Bachelor of Science in Health Services Administration is based upon the following transfer of credits:

shall generate a log indicating:


1. The names and number of students who transfer under the agreement.

Publicizing the agreement:


1. This articulation agreement will be publicized on the New York City College of Technology Health Services Administration Program's website and the Kingsborough Community College website.


