2. Procedures for evaluation agreement (i.e. tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success):

The Kingsborough Community College (KCC) and New York City College of Technology will provide the following information: a) the number of KCC graduates who applied to the program; b) the number of KCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of KCC students who enrolled in the program; d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students at NYCC

The performance of the transfer students will be monitored the performance of the transfer students.

3. Conditions and receiving college procedures for publicizing the agreement (e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisors websites, etc.):

This articulation agreement will be published on New York City College of Technology website and the Kingsborough Community College website.

Transfer advisors at KCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.
